Report related to Fundraising: Anthony opened a discussion about Cash App. Barbara stated she uses PayPal. The committee will discuss the benefits of both at a later date.

Education: Janet has not been able to talk to anyone at the school about tutoring. At the Faith Based Council Meeting, Rabbi Dorit asked about

tutoring. She was told that some student computers were not working and people were told bring them to school for exchange or repair.

They are using the learning centers at some of the schools to get help from teachers. Rabbi suggested that we could help them on Zoom at these learning center and we will check with the principals at Bagley and at Central H.S.

DION was asked to help Central High School in purchasing turkeys for seven needy families in November. In December, hygiene supplies, books, clothing and masks were given for the students. Rabbi stated we are good with Snack Packs up until March.

Picnic: We will start in March planning for the 2021 picnic. It will be Aug. 1 and the site at Belle Isle is reserved. It will be our 10th anniversary. Our budget is \$2,000-2,500 for expenses.

Interfaith Service: We can plan a service toward the end of February with singing and music via Zoom.
